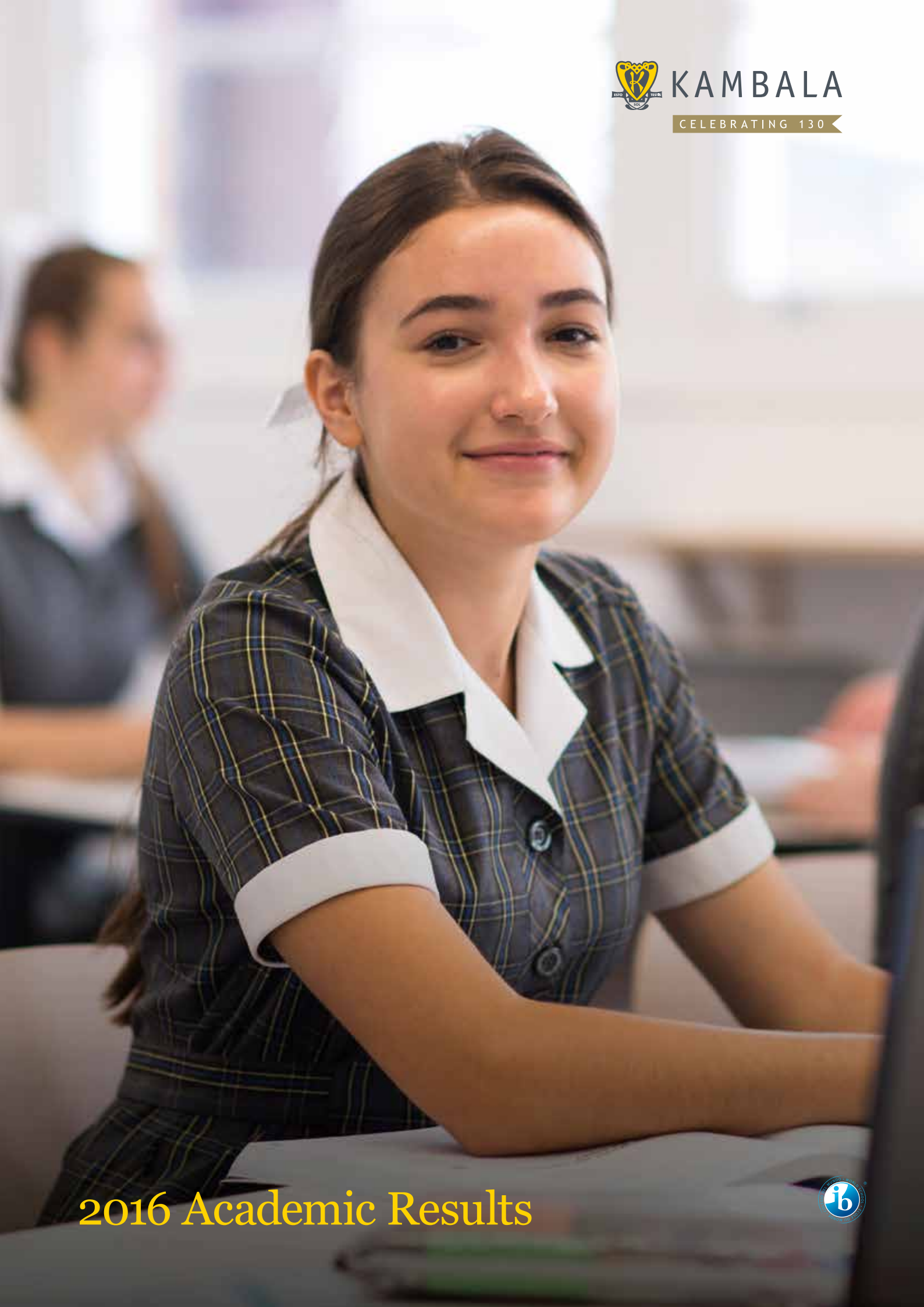

Breadth of achievement

Kambala's graduating cohort of 2016 has achieved impressive results in the Higher School Certificate (HSC) and in the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme. Combined ATAR results reveal that:

- ◆ 8 percent of Kambala's HSC and IB students gained an ATAR of 99 or above
- ◆ 40 percent gained an ATAR of 95 or above
- ◆ 64 percent gained an ATAR of 90 or above
- ◆ An impressive 88 percent gained an ATAR of 80 or above

The overall results as well as the noteworthy individual results highlight the continued distinction of the Kambala learning community and its commitment to ensuring each student achieves success and her personal best.

- ◆ 51 out of the 67 students who sat for a HSC course (76 percent of our candidature) achieved at least one subject at Band 6 level (a mark of 90 or over) and were thus included on the Distinguished Achievers List.

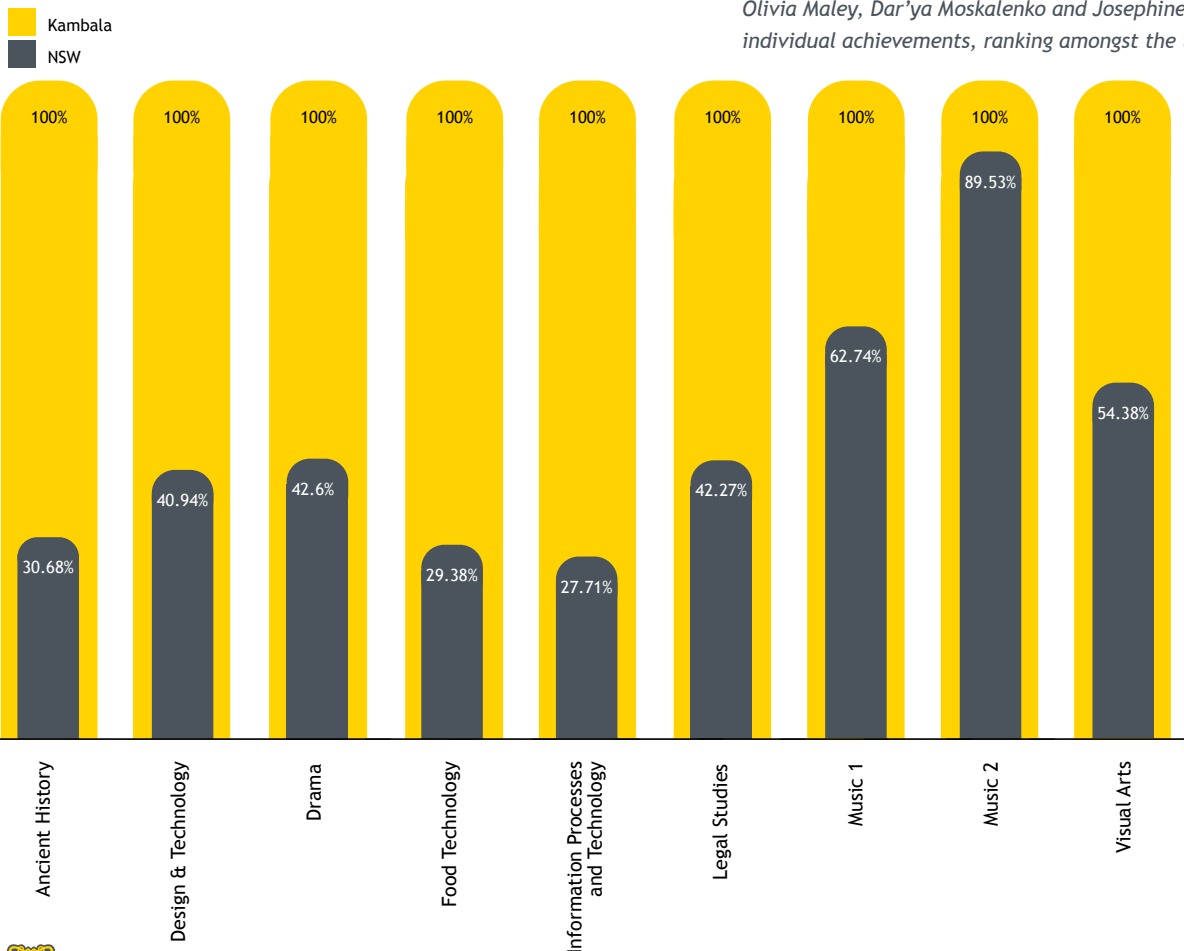

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

Nine Kambala students were enrolled in the IB Diploma Programme in 2016 and undertook a demanding program of study. In addition to six subjects studied, the girls also completed an individually researched extended essay, a Theory of Knowledge course and at least 150 hours of Creativity, Activity and Service.

Kambala IB graduates' average score was 35.5 (ATAR equivalent 92.97) in 2016, which greatly exceeds the global average of 30 (ATAR equivalent 84.70). The top possible score in the IB Diploma Programme is 45.

- ◆ 33 percent of Kambala IB graduates gained a Grade 7 result in one or more of their subjects
- ◆ 44 percent of Kambala IB graduates gained a Grade A result in Theory of Knowledge
- ◆ 44 percent of Kambala IB graduates gained a Grade A result in Extended Essay

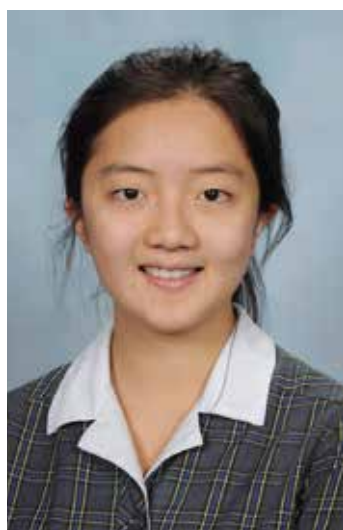
Outstanding IB achievements

- ◆ A Theory of Knowledge Grade A was awarded to Lauren Aboud, Natalie Norman and Jasmine Rou.
- ◆ An Extended Essay Grade A was awarded to Sohana Melwani, Bronte Mendham, Natalie Norman and Yuting (Nancy) Sun.

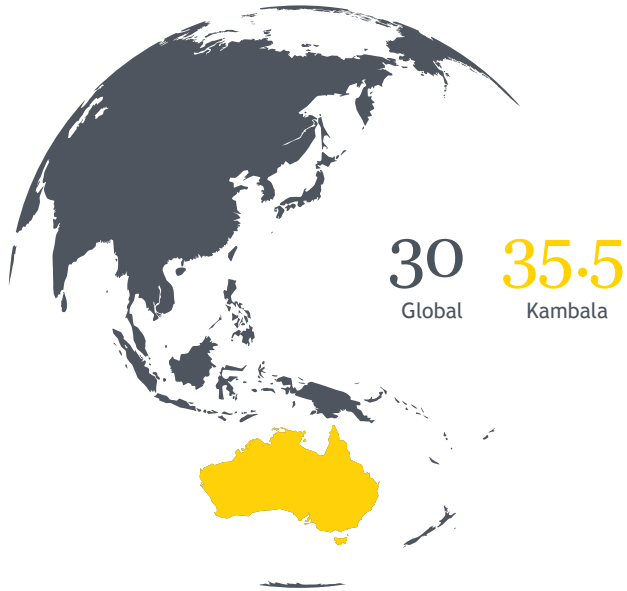
Jasmine Rou and Yuting (Nancy) Sun achieved an IB score equivalent to an ATAR result of 99.45.

Breadth of IB achievement

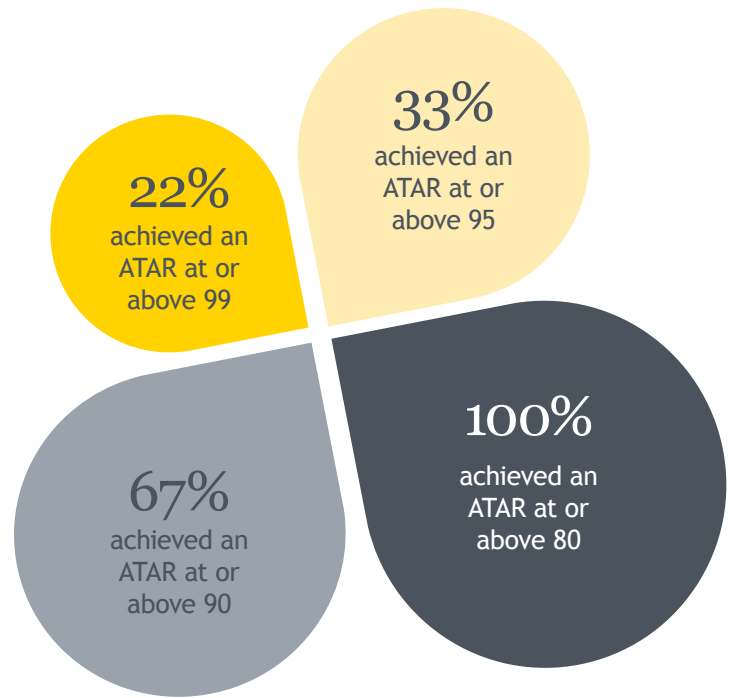
Average IB Diploma Programme points

Maximum point score for IB Diploma candidates is 45.

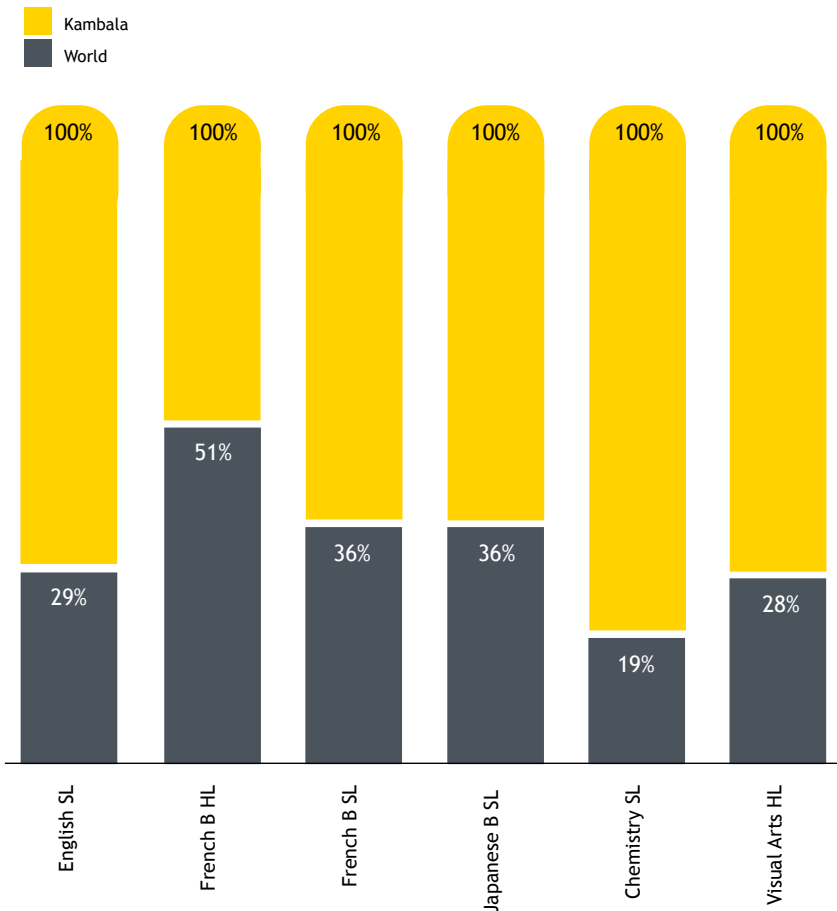
Highest Diploma points awarded to a Kambala student 42.
