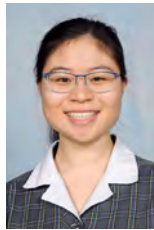

- ◆ 67 out of the 93 students who sat for a HSC course (72 percent of our candidature) achieved at least one subject at Band 6 level (a mark of 90 or over) and were thus included on the Distinguished Achievers List.

OUTSTANDING IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME RESULTS

Seventeen students were enrolled in the IB in 2018, all of whom demonstrated resilience and rigour in this demanding program of study. In addition to studying six chosen subjects, the girls also completed an individually researched Extended Essay, a Theory of Knowledge course and at least 150 hours of creativity, activity and service.

Kambala IB graduates' average score was 35 (ATAR equivalent 93.30) in 2018, which greatly exceeds the global average of 28.58 (ATAR equivalent 84.48). The top possible score in the IB Diploma Programme is 45. 10 out of 17 students received an ATAR equivalent to 90 or above. 12 percent of Kambala IB students achieved an ATAR equivalent to 99 and above.

- ◆ 65 percent of Kambala IB graduates gained a Grade 7 result in one or more of their subjects
- ◆ 35 percent of Kambala IB graduates gained a Grade A result in Extended Essay
- ◆ 100 percent of Kambala students passed the IB Diploma Programme.
- ◆ 100 percent of students achieved a Grade 7 in the following subjects: Mandarin SL and Latin HL.

Outstanding IB achievements

- ◆ This year, Virginia Su achieved an IB score of 44 out of a possible 45 points. This score is equivalent to an ATAR of 99.85. Belinda Guo achieved an IB score of 43, equivalent to an ATAR of 99.70.
- ◆ A Theory of Knowledge Grade A was awarded to Laura Shackel.
- ◆ An Extended Essay Grade A was awarded to: Jessica Altit, Olivia Clemson, Belinda Guo, Eugenie Iacono, Talulah Morrison and Virginia Su.

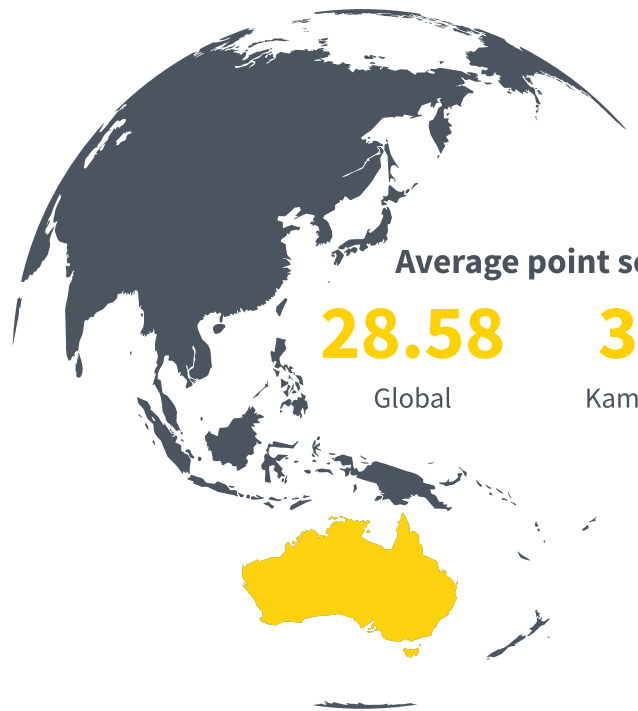


BREADTH OF IB ACHIEVEMENT

Highest Diploma points awarded to a Kambala student in 2018 is 44.

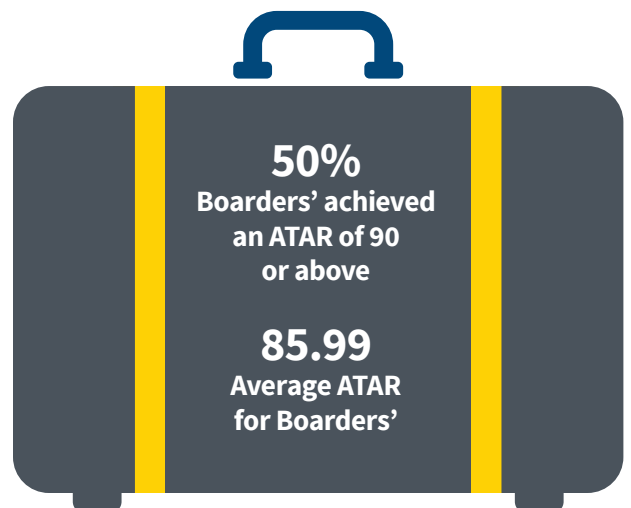
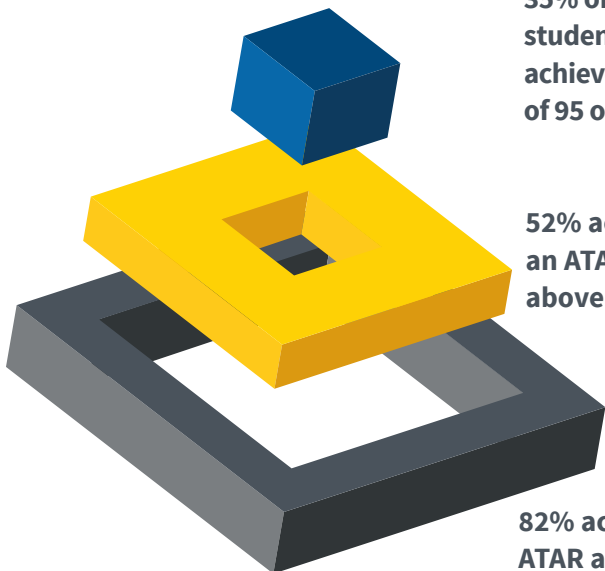


BREADTH OF BOARDERS' ACHIEVEMENT
