# Unique learning opportunities

## SIGNATURE PROGRAMMES

Our students are ambitious and driven, and our Signature Learning Programs are designed to align perfectly with their aspirations.

Our Kambala Thinking Curriculum, Altius, for Year 8 provides rich learning opportunities to ensure students develop the capabilities and dispositions necessary to succeed in, and contribute to, a complex and rapidly changing world.

Year 9 develop their Collaborative and Critical thinking skills on a bespoke Leadership Course in partnership with The Scots College, as well as developing their awareness of future pathways through a Global Study Preparation Program.

Year 10 develop their Design Thinking through our 'Rapid Value Creation Entrepreneurship Program' in partnership with University of Technology, Sydney which aims to develop entrepreneurial skills in a real world situations.

## GLOBAL CITIZEN DIPLOMA

We are committed to educating our girls to become true agents of change: globally-minded citizens who think broadly, cherish humanity and appreciate diversity.

As a key part of this vision, we have joined a prestigious global consortium of schools who offer the Global Citizen Diploma (GCD). By completing the GCD, students can earn a high school credential that recognises the many ways in which they are growing into global citizens. Kambala is the only school in Australia offering this prestigious opportunity, and it further enhances our unique ability to develop and nurture a truly global sisterhood.

Designed to complement traditional academic qualifications, the GCD will provide our students with a structured framework to develop and demonstrate skills such as intercultural understanding, ethical leadership, social responsibility, and global engagement. By requiring students to engage in reflective learning, service initiatives, cross-cultural experiences, and leadership opportunities, the diploma validates their ability to think critically about global issues and contribute meaningfully to diverse communities.

## JOINT LEARNING PATHWAYS

Kambala is one of the very few girls' schools in NSW that offers a joint learning pathway, through the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme and the Higher School Certificate (HSC).

Both the IB Diploma Programme and the HSC enable entry to university, and meet the eligibility requirements for an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) based on students' results earned through internal assessments and final examinations. This allows each girl to tailor her academic development to suit her individual interests, abilities and future plans.

Whichever path a girl chooses, she experiences a rich, diverse and challenging learning environment and finishes her secondary education with a deep sense of pride and purpose.

### The IB Diploma Programme

The IB Diploma Programme is a two-year integrated course for students seeking a globally endorsed matriculation alternative to the NSW HSC. It develops independence and university-style learning skills and is internationally recognised at the world's highest-ranking universities.

The study structure ensures a well-rounded knowledge base in a range of subject areas and encourages global thinking and community-mindedness.

### The Higher School Certificate

The HSC is the traditional pre-tertiary credential for students in New South Wales. The HSC is an internationally recognised credential that provides a strong foundation for students wishing to pursue tertiary qualifications, vocational training or employment.

To be eligible, students must meet both Year 11 Preliminary and HSC course requirements and sit for the statewide HSC examinations. We offer an extensive range of subject courses for girls to make the most of their learning and exploration.





# HAMPSHIRE HOUSE

## Co-educational early learning school

Hampshire House is our nurturing Early Learning School, and it marks the beginning of an exciting adventure for our youngest learners.

Welcoming both girls and boys aged six months to five years, Hampshire House embraces the renowned Reggio Emilia education philosophy, fostering an environment where children and adults learn and evolve together. Through engaging in long and short-term projects and play, children develop their understanding of the world, supported by an enquiry-based learning approach.

Our educational program is designed to nurture children's wellbeing, identity and sense of self as they grow into confident and inquisitive learners, and we ensure every space is thoughtfully curated to foster exploration and engagement.

We prioritise the development of essential educational, social, and self-help skills, empowering each child to become independent and lifelong learners, fuelled by a deep-seated love for learning and ready for the excitement that lies ahead in Junior School.

## Preparation to Year 6

Junior School builds on early learning foundations, while developing a deeper sense of kindness and community. During these important foundational years of schooling, we focus on building learning skills to enhance personal and academic excellence.

We offer a rich and varied curriculum that makes learning fun and ensures that every girl can participate in activities that stimulate and interest them. Our students are encouraged to pursue excellence in all that they do - whether it be through academic, sporting or creative endeavour.

Our experienced classroom teachers, specialist staff and Learning Enrichment teachers provide differentiated programs, which cater for students of varying abilities. These are enriched by specialist lessons in Science, Art, French, Music, Library, Instrumental Music (from Year 2) Drama (from Year 3) and Mandarin (from Year 5).

By the end of Year 6, she will have obtained an excellent academic foundation and benefited from a variety of social and cultural experiences. Her transition to Senior School provides wider opportunities and an exciting time to further develop her independence and confidence.

## BOARDING

Boarding at Kambala is a proud and longstanding tradition, and holds a special place within our community.

Overlooking Sydney Harbour, our purpose-built Boarding House, Fernbank, provides a nurturing and supportive Boarding experience for approximately 50 girls across Years 7 to 12. It is a warm and inclusive environment; a diverse community of young women hailing from various regions of NSW, Australia and abroad. This unique blend of cultures, personalities, interests and backgrounds creates a vibrant and dynamic environment for young women to build truly global perspectives.

Our Boarding model focuses on fostering a strong sense of belonging and community for our Boarders and their families. We support academic engagement, and place an emphasis on healthy lifestyle habits. A robust pastoral care system provides comprehensive support and assists students in their wellbeing journey.

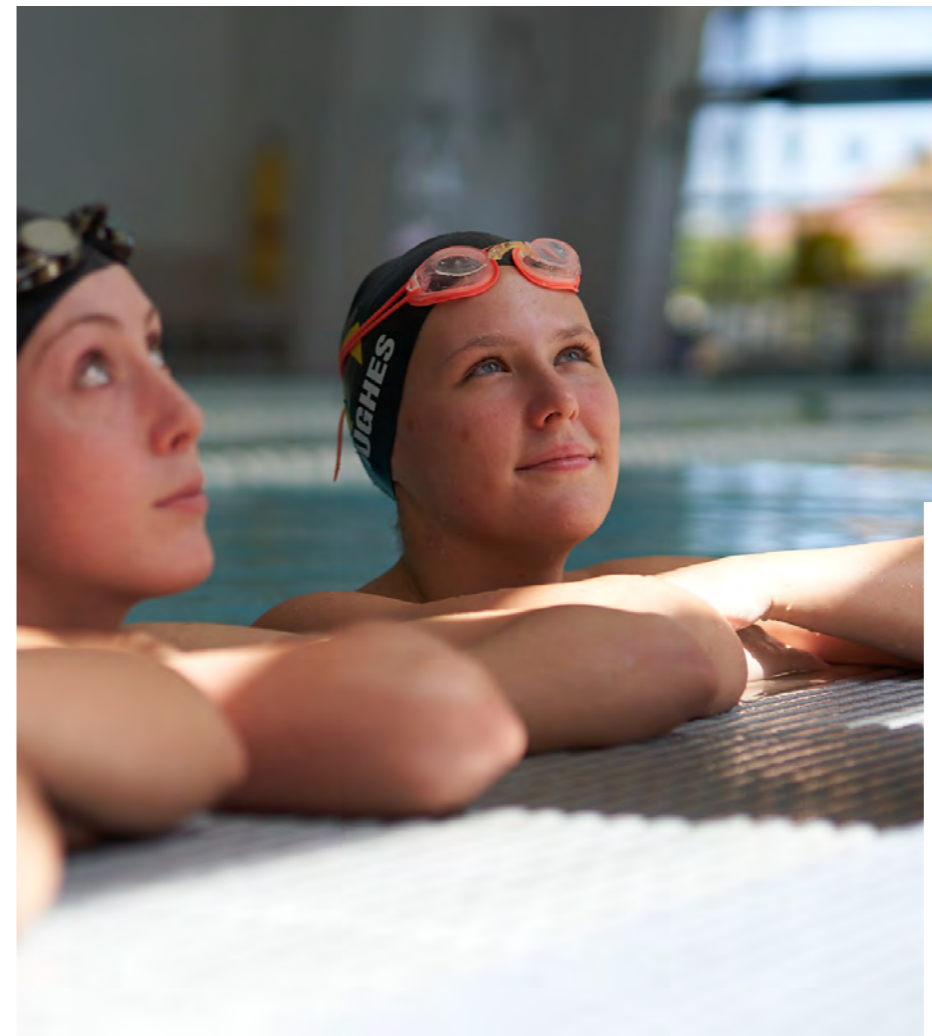
## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Kambala welcomes students from around the globe.

As well as overseas boarders, we enrol daughters of overseas visitors who hold appropriate business or temporary resident visas managed by the Department of Home Affairs. For students wishing to study for longer than three months, the Australian government allows people who are not Australian citizens or Australian permanent residents to study in Australia, provided they undertake a registered course from a registered provider.

Depending on the country of origin, students can apply for visas on-shore or off-shore. Most students in non-government schools will hold Visa Subclass 500 (Australian Schools Sector) and are required to pay fees which fully cover the cost of providing their education. Kambala is a registered provider for a small number of Full Fee Paying Overseas Students (FFPOS).

Across both Junior and Senior school we value the co- and extra curricular experiences and interests of our students.

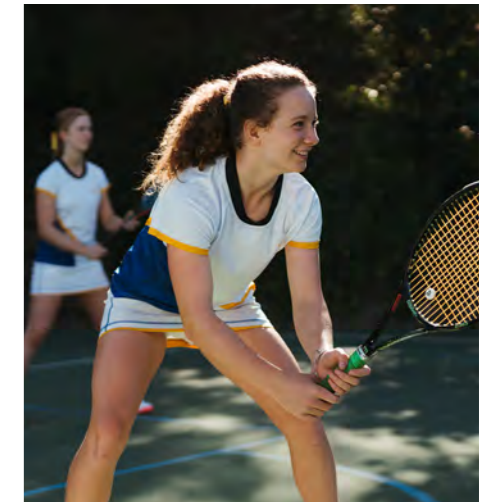

# Passion and purpose!

## MUSIC

Our vibrant and progressive Music Department is renowned for its innovative programs.

Beginning in Year 3, every student learns an orchestral instrument provided by Kambala in small groups during class time, continuing until Year 8.

Our Music Ensemble Program comprises 18 ensembles, including choirs, concert bands, jazz bands, string orchestras, and chamber groups. Collaborations with schools like Cranbrook School, The Scots College, and Sydney Grammar School broaden musical horizons. Solo performances are regular highlights, showcased in lunchtime concerts, assemblies, Music Soirées, and Year-level Recital Evenings.

All Kambala students, from Year 5 to Year 12 are involved in the Festival of Music which immerses our girls in a dynamic experience that cultivates curiosity, courage and leadership. The opportunity to join in music and song in Australia's premier concert hall, the Sydney Opera House, is a privilege and a joy.

Supporting our Music Department is an enthusiastic Music Support Group, organising fundraising activities and assisting with major events. Together, they foster a thriving musical culture at Kambala.

## SPORT

Kambala boasts a rich sporting heritage, and we actively encourage girls to engage in sports for the betterment of their overall fitness and wellness.

Our purpose-built facilities include an indoor heated pool, playing field, multi-purpose hard courts, and a gymnasium, offering an extensive range of sporting options such as Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Cross Country, Football, Gymnastics, Hockey, Learn to Sail, Netball, Snowsports, Swimming, Tennis, Touch and Water Polo.

We prioritise excellence in sports by employing specialists, including Olympic and State-level coaches, to collaborate with our staff in training girls across all sporting disciplines.

Kambala actively participates in major carnivals for Athletics, Cross Country, Gymnastics, Swimming and Tennis. Our commitment to sports development is evident through our representation in IGSA, NSWCIS, NSW All Schools, Snowsports and Australian teams, highlighting our developing talent and promoting sportsmanship at every level.
